ORDINANCE NO. 545-2024

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CAPE MAY  
REGARDING DRIVEWAY LINE STRIPING

WHEREAS, Section 7-54 of the City of Cape May Municipal Code establishes a permitting process for parking in front of private driveways; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has recommended amending the code to add a fee for driveway line striping outside of what is already addressed in the Private Driveway Parking permitting process; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of the City Manager's recommendation, the City Council deems it in the City's best interests of the City to amend the City Code as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Cape May in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 7-54 of the City of Cape May Code is amended as follows (~~striketrough~~ portions indicating deletions and **bold/underline** portions indicating new language):

**§ 7-54.3. Annual permit fee. [Amended 9-7-2021 by Ord. No. 439-2021]**

A. A permit fee of \$25 per permit shall be paid at the time that the application is filed and shall be paid upon any annual renewal. In addition, any applicant requesting painting or striping for driveway parking permitted herein shall be subject to an additional \$100 fee which represents the anticipated costs of time and materials for the Public Works Department to perform such work. In the event that a permit is lost or destroyed, the applicant shall pay a fee of \$25 for a duplicate hang-tag permit.

A.B. Should an applicant be denied a Private Driveway Parking Permit but still want the driveway striped, the applicant shall pay an additional \$100 in addition to the \$25 permit fee referenced above for the City providing that service, or should a property owner wish to have their private or commercial driveway striped without obtaining a Private Driveway Parking Permit, the fee for driveway line striping shall be \$125.


**SECTION 2.** All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.


**SECTION 3.** Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall become effective 20 days after final passage and publication, according to law.
